

Student Employment

Shawnee State provides a variety of opportunities for part-time campus employment. Many of these positions are funded as part of the need-based Federal Work Study Program.

Merit-Based Aid

Shawnee State University is pleased and proud to be able to offer more than 200 scholarships based on outstanding academic ability and individual achievement. These scholarship funds are provided through the generosity of donors and many are administered through the SSU Development Foundation. The University offers two levels of academic scholarship—the President's Scholarship and the University Professor's Scholarship.

The **President's Scholarship** is awarded to new freshman students who have achieved a composite score of 26 or higher on the ACT* or 1170 or higher on the SAT* and have a high school grade point average* of at least 3.80 (4.0 scale). The President's Scholarship is *full in-state tuition (less state grants) and renewable* for seven semesters provided the student meets certain SSU grade point average and academic progress requirements.

The **University Professor's Scholarship** is for new freshman students and is also based on the student's ACT/SAT composite score* and high school grade point average*. The amounts of this scholarship vary from \$500 to one-half the amount of in-state tuition. The University Professor's Scholarship is also renewable, based on the SSU grade point average and academic progress.

*The Application for Admission along with qualifying ACT/SAT score and grade point average must be submitted to the Office of Admission no later than February 1, 2016.

The chart below outlines this scholarship program.

Loans

Federal Direct Subsidized Loan - this federal loan is for undergraduate students who demonstrate financial need and are enrolled at least half time in an eligible program. Eligibility is determined by the FAFSA. The subsidized loan program is limited to \$3,500 for the freshman year, \$4,500 for the sophomore year, and \$5,500 per year for the junior and senior years.

Repayment begins six months after graduation, when you stop attending college, or if you are attending less than half time.

For example, a student has an ACT composite of 23 and a cumulative high school grade point average of 3.62. This student would receive the University Professor's Scholarship in the amount of \$1500.
